Ten El Camino College students were honored this week with special commendations for outstanding achievement in the division of physical sciences.

Voter Registration Now Open; Deputies Listed

September 10 is the deadline for registration of voters for the November 1964 Presidential election.

There are six classes of persons who should register or re-register for the election. They are:

- Those who have changed their addresses since they last registered.
- Those who have changed their names since they last registered.
- Those who desire to change their political affiliation.
- Those voters whose registrations were cancelled because they did not vote at the General Election in 1962.
- Those who have become of age, and have not registered.
- New residents of Los Angeles County, who will have the required qualifications by the date of the election. These qualifications are:
 - a. One year residence in the State.
 - b. Ninety days residence in the County.
 - c. Twenty-one years of age.
 - d. A naturalized citizen must have been a citizen for at least 90 days prior to the date of the election, and must show his naturalization papers to the deputy, when registering for the first time.
 - e. All voters must be able to read the English language and sign their names.

FOLLOWING IS a list of field deputies in the Torrance area where persons may register for voting in the coming elections. Most of the locations are private residences, and persons desiring to register will, in most cases, be able to register during reasonable hours during the week and on Saturdays and Sundays.
