# Even Mosk May Qualify For Rifle Association

On May 19, 1964, Stanley Mosk, Attorney General for the State of California, elected by the people of California, released to the press a letter addressed to the Governor of the State of California, Edmund G. "Pat" Brown, recommending to the Governor that a complete list of gun clubs in California, containing the names of all members and officers, be obtained from the National Rifle Association of America, and forwarded to the California Bureau of Criminal Identification and Investigation, in Sacramento, for a check.

On May 21, 1964, five days later, Stanley Mosk addressed a letter to the Mosk addressed of Defense, McNamara—the man who was the genius responsible for the manufacture of the unsaleable Edsel car by the Ford company—requesting information as to the amount of free ammunition and the number of firearms distributed to clubs in California participating in the marksmanship training program of the U. S. National Board for the Promotion of Rifle Practice, which is the U. S. agency which is by law authorized to encourage civilians to learn marksmanship to improve our skill in the right to possess and carry arms, guaranteed us by the U. S. Constitution.

At the same time, that great exponent of law and order, the Honorable Stanley Mosk, recommended to federal officials that they tighten controls at the federal level on arms and ammunition distributed by the U. S. Army through the U. S. Director of Civilian Marksmanship. Our great, and possibly worthy, Attorney General Stanley Mosk, then went on to say

that this action was part of an over-all policy to prevent the formation of private armies by "fanatics and extremists."

IT IS SOMETIMES difficult to understand Stanley Mosk. Was he trying to protect the majority of the good citizens of California from fanatic fellow-travellers of the communist party? Was the Honorable Stanley Mosk attempting to protect the patriotic, law-abiding people of California, who are in the majority, from attacks by left-wing extremists who riot in the streets and stage disorderly and illegal demonstrations right in the Capitol of the State of California, in Sacramento, where Stanley spends part of his crowded life?

Perhaps Stanley Mosk was looking ahead to some future event, such as the National Democratic Convention of 1964. Again, perhaps he was
