

Rabies Clinics Slated In Carson Area July 30

Two rabies clinics will be sponsored by the Carson Chamber of Commerce, according to John Calas, president of the chamber.

Both clinics will be held from 7 to 8 p.m. Thursday, July 30. One clinic will be held at the Try-It Stores, 23033 S. Avalon Blvd., and one at the Farmers Outlet, Carson Street and Wilmington Avenue.

Dogs will be vaccinated with the chick embryo vaccine, a two-year vaccine, at a cost of \$1.50 for each injection.

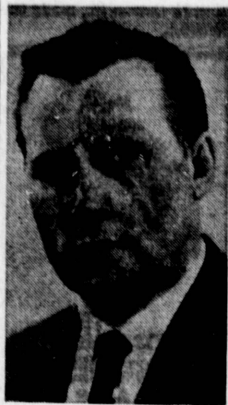
About 40 volunteers will

be needed to help staff the clinics and write certificates, according to Calas. Volunteers may call DA 6-1006 before 10 a.m. July 28.

The Southern California Veterinary Medical Association, co-sponsors of the clinic, will send members to give the injections.

The clinic is the 10th annual clinic for the Carson Chamber of Commerce. Last year, 1,250 dogs were vaccinated in a 90-minute period—a new county record. County pound officials will be on hand to issue licenses.

School, PTA Officials Discuss Mental Health

A large number of Torrance students who need help with academic or behavioral problems which Torrance school psychologists are unable to handle will be the topic for a discussion next month.

Dr. Louis Kaplan, assistant superintendent of schools for special services; Robert S. Dollarhide, guidance consultant; Mrs. James Orr, president of the Torrance Council PTA; Mrs. Jack Till, PTA mental health chairman, and Dr. Peter Guzvich, psychologist in charge of the Long Beach branch of the State Mental Hygiene Clinic, will be participants in the meeting. The American Medical Association recently named

mental illness as the number one health problem in the nation and estimated about 5 per cent of all school children have emotional problems beyond the scope of school psychologists.

In Torrance, the estimate would mean 1,500 children need some kind of help with academic or emotional problems.

SCHOOL psychologists serve about half that number each year, according to district records. A large number of these students are referred to clinics or family physicians because additional diagnosis or treatment is indicated.
