### Seven Vice Principals Reassigned

Assignments for the vice principals in the Torrance schools were announced this week by the Board of Education.

Two schools which previously have had vice principals will be staffed only by a principal during the coming year. Both schools, Madrona and Meadow Park, have lost enrollment and are no longer large enough to warrant a vice principal.

Hickory School, with an anticipated enrollment of 825, will have a vice principal for the first time. He is Andrew W. Kovach, previously assigned to Seaside School.

Frank E. Tyrrell, previously assigned to Meadow Park, will move to Fern-Greenwood School. He replaces Ronald J. Hall Jr., the newly appointed principal at the Joseph Arnold School.

George C. Chalekson, previously at Riviera School, moves to Anza School, and Wilbert L. Eden, now at Anza School, moves to Riviera. Cecil R. Paschall moves from Victor School to Seaside, and Geneva S. Shelton will remain at Torrance Elementary School.

In the other change, Cyril J. Levine moves to Victor School, replacing Paschall. School, replacing Paschall. Levine has been assigned to Madrona.

### Seek Two Nurses for Teaching

Two Harbor area registered nurses are being sought by the Los Angeles City School system for teaching assignments at Harbor General Hospital.

The two nurses are needed to conduct a refresher training class for registered nurses and a course for licensed vocational nurses at the hospital.

Applicants for the two assignments should have considerable background in nursing and some teaching experience, according to George M. Winder, supervisor of manpower development and training for the Los Angeles schools.

The refresher class will begin Aug. 17 and meet daily from 6 to 10 p.m. for 10 weeks. The vocational nursing course will begin about Sept. 15 and meet daily for 10 weeks from 8 a.m. to 3:30 p.m.
