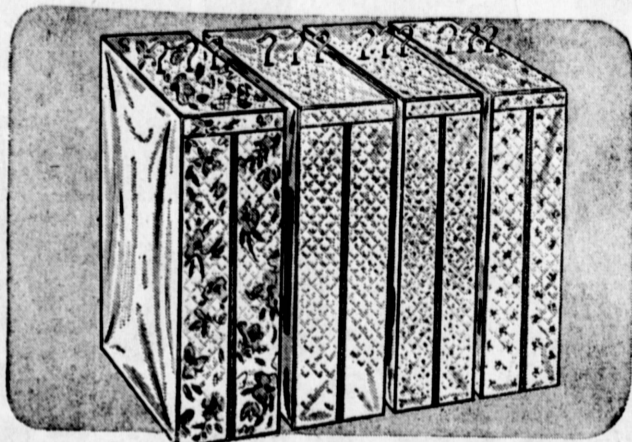
There will be speakers, colored slides and refreshments. The public is invited.

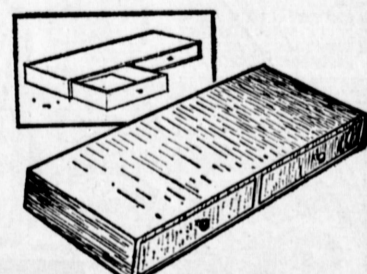
