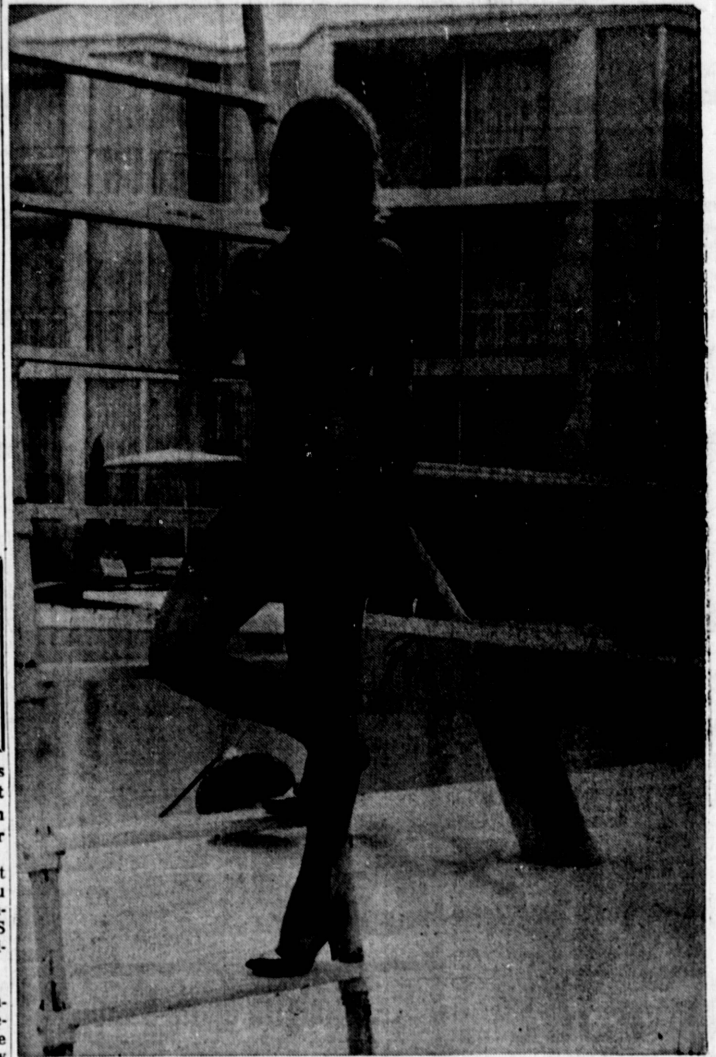

To quote the title of one of the songs from the Rodgers and Hammerstein musical "The Sound of Music," this is certainly one of my favorite things, particularly when produced with such flair as it was by the Long Beach Civic Light Opera Association in the Long Beach Arena Concert Hall.

There is gaiety in the music as well as the lyrics and dialogue as written by Lindsay and Crouse from the true life story of the famous Trapp Family Singers. The tale of Maria, portrayed with spirit by Lois Beane, becoming governess and finally mother to the seven children of Captain George von Trapp is the 20th Century "Gunderella" story. The amazing fact that it actually happened during World War II in Austria only adds enchantment.

As Von Trapp, Marvin Cloyd is exceptionally fine. His voice is rich and he invests the role with a veracity not always encountered in the musical theater these days. The third member of the would-be love triangle, Elsa Schraeder, was interpreted with verve and understanding by Yvonne June while Ken Shanks was entertaining as Max Detweiler.

The production was directed by Kathy Davis with musical numbers staged by Bill Roberts and Jack Kroesen as musical director.
