TORRANCE - Previews on the biggest Torrance Handicap of the year show Victor E. Benstead as being the most likely of the eight candidate vying for the two seats on the City Council, which will be decided when Torrance residents choose their representatives April II. This opinion is based on a three-week careful survey

of the Torrance "Central" and outlying districts by the Press. If accurate, the survey shows that Benstead is likely to win a seat on the council by strong margin, with A. J. Patronsky C. Ed. Jones and George W. Downing running a close second.


