While in high school he secured employment with the Redondo Breeze, and thus started a career as a printer. He served an apprenticeship in the composing room of that newspaper to secure a union card, after which he was employed on the Los Angeles Herald and later on the Westwood Hills Press.

At this point in his life, deciding against a life time career as a printer, Larsen moved on to the Columbia Steel Company and later became a member of the sales staff of the Union Oil
