"Gray Ladies" Sought by Hospital

TORRANCE, May 24.—An urgent appeal for women to serve as Red Cross Gray Ladies at Harbor General Hospital was issued today by Mrs. F. C. Haynes, chairman of the Gray Ladies Service for Los Angeles Red Cross Chapter. "The need for Red Cross Gray Ladies in tuberculosis wards has reached an acute stage," Mrs. Haynes pointed out. "Patients here, unlike those in Veteran Administration hospitals, do not have the advantage of visits and other services performed by representatives of veteran auxiliaries and other units, and consequently are quite alone. Gray Ladies not only visit with these patients, but perform extra-curricular activities such as writing letters and carrying out shopping errands for them." "Qualifications for Red Cross Gray Ladies include the age limits of between 25 and 55, and housewives whose children are over 10 years of age," Mrs. Haynes explained.

Endorsements Are Listed

Attorney General Fred N. Howser, seeking re-election at the June 6th Primary, on both the Republican and Democratic tickets, today received the endorsement of The Jeffersonian Democrats, according to an announcement of State Chairman James W. Mellen. The strategy committee of the Jeffersonian Democrats, consisting of William B. Ingoldsby, Mrs. Virginia Smith, Robert Tevlin, John Oswald Herbold and Mellen, voted unanimously to endorse Howser. "Attorney General Howser's record clearly shows that he stands for Constitutional Government and that he is making a splendid fight for preservation of States Rights in connection with the Tidelands Oil Title litigation which, we believe, constitutes sufficient reason why the California voters should return him to office," Mellen declared.
