### Store Units Being Built In Lomita

LOMITA — Work is now underway on a \$75,000 shopping center at 248th St. and Narbonne Ave., Glen Keith, of Keith and Keith Builders, announced Saturday.

Arrangements have been made with several business firms to lease stores in the shopping center, which will have a total of 10 separate units when the project is completed, Keith said.

An overall area of 31,000 square feet will be in the buildings. To make way for the shopping center, a Lomita landmark that dates back to 1923, a large sheet metal building that has housed a machine shop, will be removed from the southeast corner of Narbonne Ave. and 248th St.

A men's clothing store, barber shop, shoe repair shop, health food store, and shoe store, are among the business firms negotiating for quarters in the shopping center, the builder said.

Keith stated the project will be completed by the end of this year. It will be on the east side of Narbonne Ave. and extend south from the corner to 248th St. to the Kiwanis Scout Hall midway in the block.

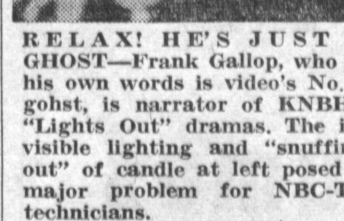
