Perry School Construction Underway

FORMER TORRANCE TRACK STAR TO PREACH IN JAPAN

Former Torrance Athlete and world famous war hero, Louis Zamperini, will leave for Japan September 28th to preach Christianity.

In 1936 while still a high school boy, he represented the City of Torrance in the Olympic Games at Berlin.

During World War II he renowned himself by spending 47 days on a life raft before his capture and internment by the Japanese.

Airstrip Named for Zamperini The local Torrance airstrip has been named in his honor. Zamperini again hit the headlines last November 7th, when he was "converted" in a giant tent revival under the ministry of evangelist Billy Graham. Since that time he has toured United States and Canada, telling of his thrilling experiences. Most recently he has been actively engaged in juvenile delinquency work.

By personal invitation of General Douglas MacArthur, Zamperini will return to Japan. There, under the auspices of Youth For Christ International, he will preach Christianity to a religion starved people, who are

close to the dangers of Communism.

Zamperini will be honored at a luncheon to be held for him next Monday. Roy McKeown, Vice President of Youth For Christ, and city officials will be among those present.

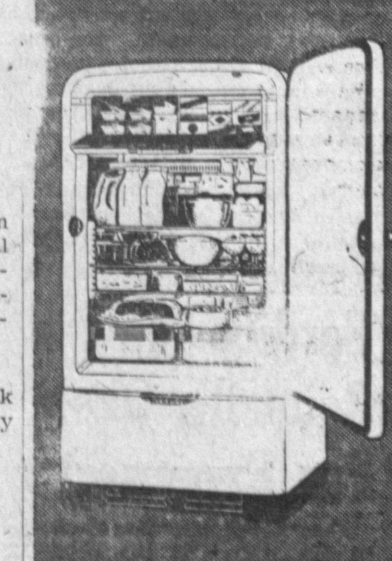
