by Clarence McFadden. Mayer told Powell, Haggard, and also the Press that the escrow instructions for the deal had been drawn up, that they were in the hands of his attorney, Neil McCarthy, and that he would sign them at once, unless granted the relief asked of the City of Torrance.

Torrance-Lomita Realty Board vas active in trying to get to the "bottom" of the trouble with Mayer's group, and Hollywood Riviera Home Owners Association, headed by W. A. Mason, chose not to consider the matter as serious and elected to insist that Mayer be required to install sidewalks in spite of what Mason onsidered a "bluff."
