

(Continued from Page One) use of 150 gallons of water per day for each person," he continued, "this means an added draft upon the depleted ground waters of the basin of 2164 acre-feet per year each year hereafter. If this rate of growth continues for the next 10 years, by 1960 the added draft on the basin will be 31,640 acre-feet per year."

The only solution appears to be the increased use of Metropolitan water and immediate preventative measures to stop further basin destruction by intruding ocean water, it was said.

Warren Butler, vice chairman of Metropolitan Water District board, has declared that Metropolitan will not always be able to meet peak summer demands, and people of the West Basin must therefore continue to rely on pumping from the West Basin supply which soon will be destroyed unless corrective action is taken soon, according to the report.
