Tones of the Freedom Bell now are being heard 15 times a day as station breaks between foreign language broadcasts of Radio Free Europe.

The contributions from millions of Americans met the cost of erecting the bell and help pay the way of the radio broadcasts that are designed to beam the truth beyond the iron curtain.
