First Christian Church to Start Special Evangelical Workshop

A special Workshop in Evangelism is to begin at the First Christian Church this Sunday morning.

He is now the chaplain of the large hospital of his own city. Rev. Newman is a graduate of Ohio State University with his A. B. degree. His seminary graduate work was completed in Lexington, Kentucky at the College of the Bible. He graduated with honors in scholarship from the seminary.

Rev. Newman has held pastorate in Kenton, Ohio, and his present pastorate where he has been for four years. His work with young people and the conference program of the Disciples of Christ is another place where he has distinguished himself with his leadership and ability.

This highway serves best those motorists—ourselves, who use it rightly and observe its traffic regulations and so becomes more personal to us."
