As Prehistoric Markings on a stone found along the Palos Verdes shoreline by a Torrance woman were definitely left by some prehistoric beast, she was told this week by experts at the Los Angeles County Museum.

Mrs. Margie Craig of 1923 Revnosa drive said that authorities identified the impressions as those left by the ribs of some ancient animal some two or three million years ago.

Apparently the monster's remains became buried at or just after the time of his death. For thousands of years the bones were embedded in a shale formation of the Miocene age. They were dislodged comparatively recently by erosion, the museum

experts believe. Mrs. Craig found the relic, a flat stone, while walking along the rocky beach just east of the Vicente lighthouse on Point Easter.

The museum decision vindicated the belief of Mrs. Craig and her daughter, Mrs. E. K. Cunningham, of the Reynosa drive address. They had defended their views of the marks' significance against the scoffings of Mr. Cunningham.




