Experienced Showman Takes Over Harbor Drive-In Theatre

Greene has not only played on the Broadway stage four times, operated theatres all over the country, acted on the stage of the Pasadena Community Playhouse,

Greene is also the originator and copyright owner of the "Green Buck Auction" soon to be enjoyed at the Harbor Drive-in Lions Club at its meeting in the Theatre.




