Another factor which has contributed to the economy in the Torrance program has been careful perusal of the plans to eliminate unnecessary pipes by planning the plumbing for minimum distances and using the shortest distance between two points, instead of going around the building, or over the "barn."

## Administrator For Edison Hits Tax Spending

If you are a resident of Los Angeles, your future standard of living and your budget problems are going to have rougher going by a new burden of some \$1,800.

A new high in peace-time spending is marked up in the latest Federal tax measure every wage and salary earner in Los Angeles.

Lane D. Webber, Vice President, Southern California Edison Company, and a National Vice President of the National Asocileased this figure and others compiled by the NAM.

He declared that the failure of the Federal Government to cut down on unnecessary and nondefense spending means that every California wage and salary earner's share of the national debt now approaches \$5,000.

Webber charged: "New tax bills passed since the outbreak of the Korean war added a burden of \$242,208,070 to Los Angeles' share of the cost of federal government in 1952, yet we still see no effective attempt being made to cut down on government spending and pay off the national debt. In eighteen out of the last twenty years, our government has spent more than it took in." he explained "If the average citizen ran his financial affairs this way, he'd be rated as an irresponsible spendthrift."


