CUMBERSOME TRAVELING "As an example," he said, "there is no direct method for workers to travel to and from Los Angeles in this area. Even the bus system to Long Beach is cumbersome. Workers from Torrance would have a difficult, if not impossible situation if they tried to use public transportation to our plant."

Harvey said whether the expansion program remains in this area will to a great extent be up to Torrance.

"If we can bring the labor market to this area, then it will be to our benefit to remain at the present location," Harvey declared. "If we cannot get cooperation on the transportation problem then it will be more economical to expand in another location."

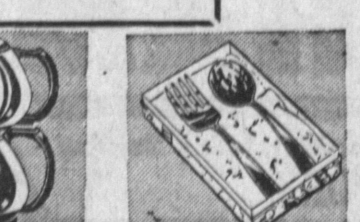
