The employers termed demands of the Union "fantastic." Principal differences in the negotiations are the union proposal for a five-day eight-hours-a-day week: the union's proposal for eliminating the 'arbitration-no strike" cause; and the union's demand for \$5.00 a week, across the board, for clerks.

ARBITRATION CLAUSE

"We will put up a fight for the arbitration clause," said Binkley. 'In fact, we want it strengthened, because we do not consider it adequate." The employers also will demand that the present practice of permitting clerks to work six days of six and two-thirds hours be continued.
