Superintendent of Schools J. H. Hull, Ph.D., gave his ideas on the school bond election, the campaign for which is progressing quietly.

Even Baldwin had the opportunity to speak in the "open forum"—conducted ably by Beasley in the highest tradition of American democracy, in contrast to the unfavorable light which Baldwin, in his "cute" style, has futilely attempted to falsify TUT and its published purposes—that is, published only in the Torrance Press.

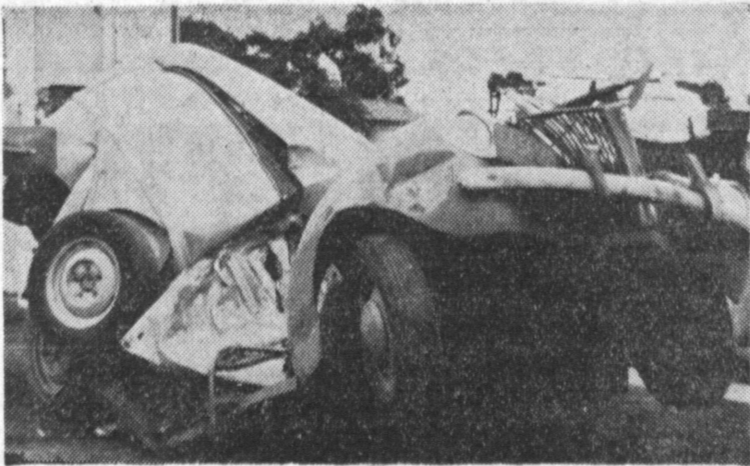
The "boss" paper had a copy, too, but did not see fit to inform its readers of the real purpose behind Torrance Unified Taxpayers, a non-profit California corporation.

operate said pit, and on November 13, 1951, it was recommended at this Council meeting by Mr. Joseph that he be issued the license.

PIT IN A-1 ZONE

This pit is located in an A-1 Zone, which is an agricultural zone. A license was issued on December 27, 1951, stating soil-ified subjects, such as dirt, would be dumped into the pit. Thru a recent investigation we have found the owner has set up a gas pump to transfer oil and other liquids from trucks into this pit. The water measures, in places, approximately three feet. The solid materials, such as mud, oil-soaked dirt, and trash, have been dumped on the north side of the pit, in full view of the residents.

A State Law requires all sumps near residential areas be

fenced, yet, a small group of City officials, seemingly overlooked this important protection, vital to any community, and issued the license to operate without being fenced.

At present there are between three and four thousand residents in our community. We are a part of Torrance and as voters and taxpayers, demand our rightful protection. This pit is

a hazard to our children, and we feel it is the Council's duty to enforce this law before a tragedy occurs.

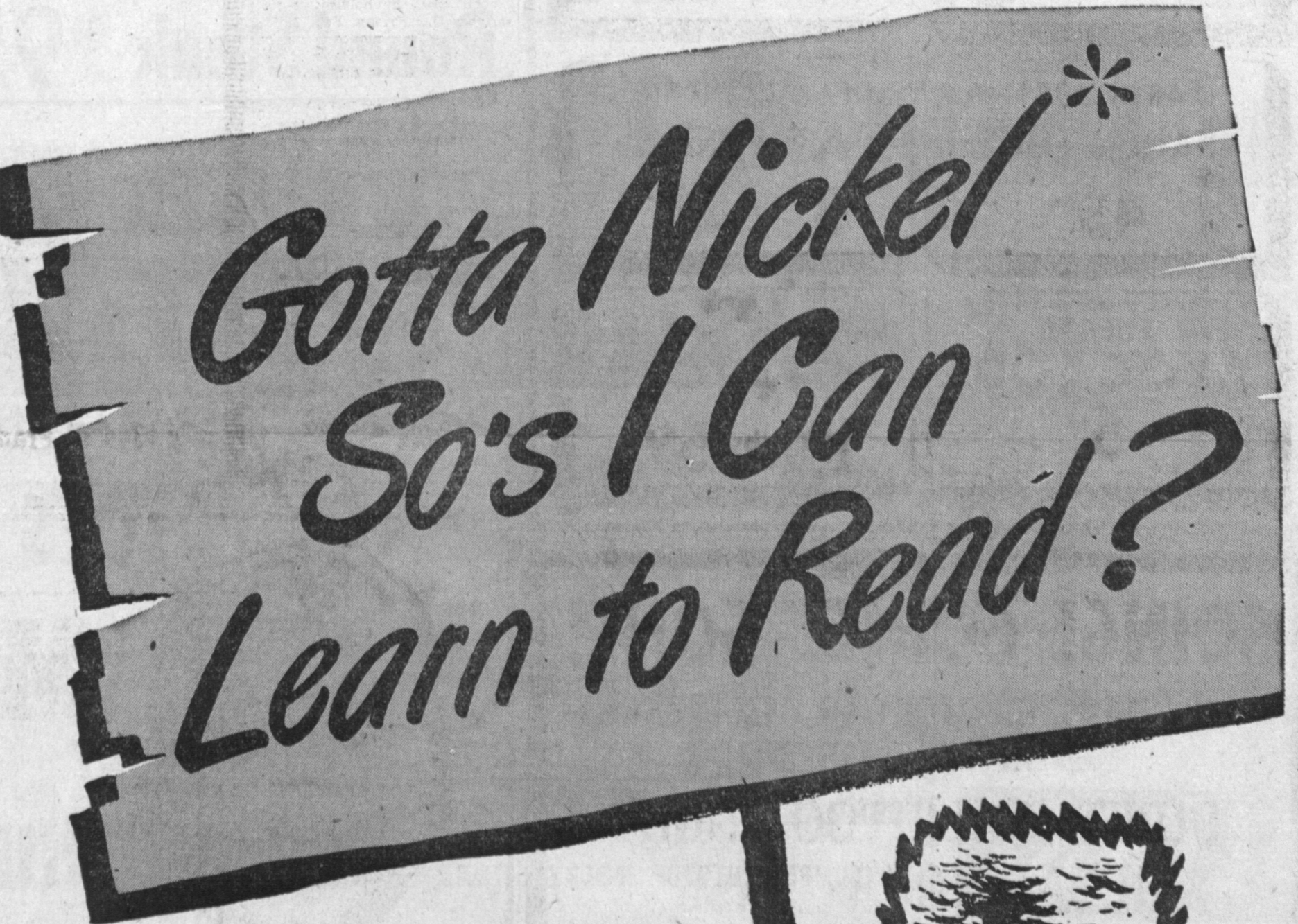
