### 1952 Red Cross Fund Appeal Now Underway

Since the kick-off of the 1952 American National Red Cross Fund Appeal in Torrance last Monday, fund campaigners have begun making the rounds of residences and firms in this area to explain how Red Cross dollars are spent as they seek contributions for the coming year.

Stressing the increase of Red Cross services since the beginning of the Korean War, Lester T. King, Torrance Fund Chairman, mentioned that from Nov. 12, 1950, when the first Red Cross Service club was opened in Korea, through Dec. 31, 1951, installations of this type in Korea served a total of 644,000 gallons of coffee and 18,421,000 doughnuts.

Chairman King also pointed out that the cost of supplying Korean forces with personal articles lost in combat such as toothbrushes, tooth paste, soap, writing paper and others, was \$470,000.
