Suicide Lives 12 Hours with Head Wound

Torrance police report that a suicide found lying in a field, lived for almost 12 hours with a .45-calibre bullet hole in his head.

Gosta K. Peterstrom, 27, was found about 5:30 one morning last week, with the gaping wound. He succumbed at 4 a.m. the following day at Harbor General Hospital without regaining consciousness.

Investigators said the slug entered the victim's forehead, apparently coursed through part of the brain and exited through the left side of the head.

Peterstrom had been residing in Redondo Beach with a friend, who found a rambling note. His widow, from whom he had separated, resides in Manhattan Beach.

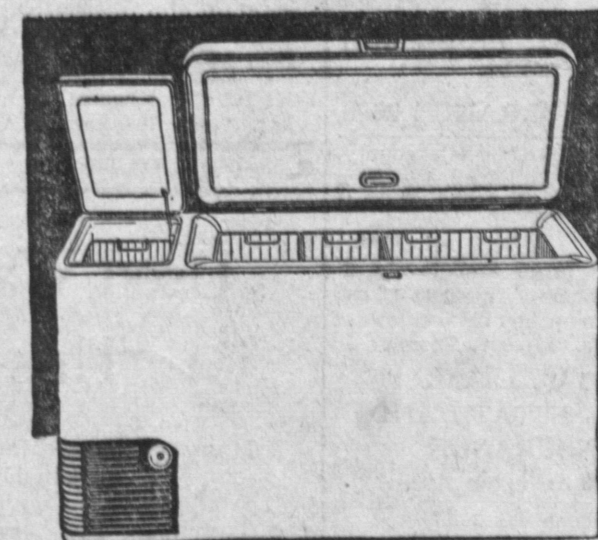
