

Keystone Boy To Undergo New Operations

The second in a new series of operations to restore his voice will soon be undergone by six-year-old Forrest Thomas, son of Mrs. Harrie Thomas, of 23435 Panama avenue, Keystone.

Forrest, now in Children's Hospital, Los Angeles, has had more than 100 previous operations to rebuild his trachea, literally burned out of his throat when he drank acid two years ago by accident.

The lad talks from his stomach and breathes through a hole in his neck, according to his mother. The new series of operations are designed to open a trachea built by plastic surgery from skin from Forrest's arm.

Doctors at the hospital do not know how long it will take to rebuild the damaged windpipe, it was reported, but an operation last week was successful and this strengthened hope the boy will be able to live a normal life when the surgery is finished.

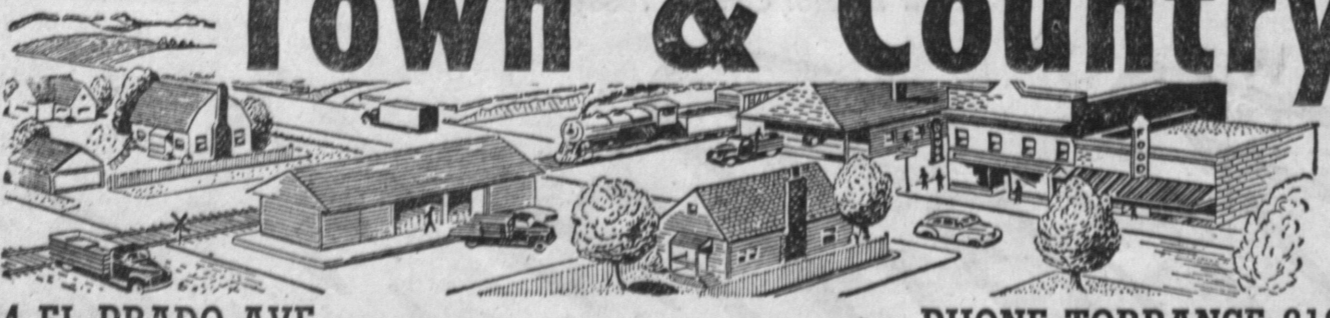
