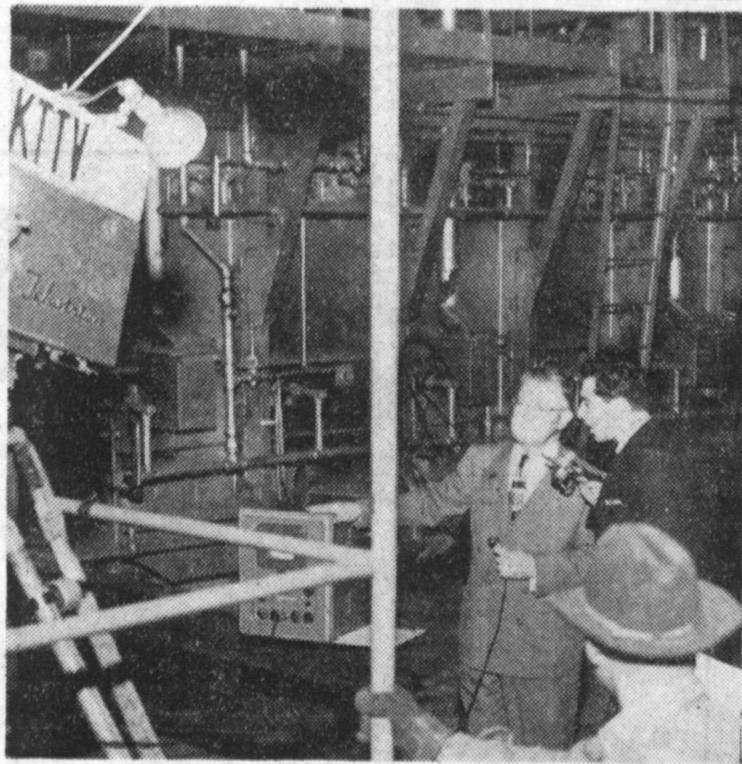
It's all in the spirit of good clean college fun and local grocers may take the tip and stock up on the fruit and makings for good homemade pies.
