General Thanked for Harvey Machine Presses

Maj. Gen. William H. Morgan, USAF, Western Air Procurement commander, was officially commended by the Los Angeles county supervisors and city councilmen for his help in obtaining major facilities on the West Coast under the Air Forces' heavy press program.
General Morgan was commended upon receipt of news that the Harvey Machine Co., Torrance, has obtained an Air Force contract for the installation and operation of four giant aluminum extrusion presses of 8,000 tons and 20,000 tons and two heavy forging presses of 25,000 tons and 35,000 tons.
The forging presses will be operated in structures almost

ten stories high, construction of which will start this spring. Once completed, these presses will provide West Coast aircraft designers and manufacturers with access to giant extrusions and forgings for the construction of airborne equipment having sizes and performance characteristics previously impractical or impossible, the supervisors were informed.
The resolutions emphasize that the presses will advance "the competitive forces necessary for industrial security and advancement of the West Coast aircraft industry, a forward step in maintaining the leadership of the West Coast in the field of aeronautical manufacturing and design."
