Steel Mill Seizure Is **Ordered**

of Columbia Steel Co. in Torrance, as well as their families and the business men of Torrance, gave a sigh of relief yesterday as announcement was made that there would be no immediate steel strike.

Instead of permitting the important basic industry of the nation to shut down and thus cripple defense production, President Truman invoked his constitutional powers and ordered government seizure of the mills. They will continue in operation under government control until industry and labor get together on their differences.

The Torrance Columbia works as well as other steel plants throughout the nation already had started the long process of shutting down as of midnight Tuesday.

However, the secretary of commerce was instructed to take over the plants, and all workers were told to be at their jobs yesterday morning as the government took steps to keep the mills in operation.

Government officials reported the industry had agreed to grant 650,000 steel workers 171/2 cent wage hikes, but balked on the union shop issue and extra pay for Sunday work.
