### Kauffman Co. Gets College Board OK on \$406,870 Bid

Milton Kauffman Construction Co., of Gardena was awarded a contract for the construction of a library-classroom building by the El Camino College District Board of Trustees, it was announced Tuesday by the college. The Kauffman bid for the job was \$406,870. The building will be located between the Campus Center and Administration buildings on the campus. Construction is expected to begin in April or May.

El Camino college has been built on a pay-as-you-go basis with money obtained through tax assessments in the college district.
