Three Hour Service To Honor Easter

The annual three-hour Good-Friday Service, sponsored by the Torrance Council of Churches will be held this year at the Civic Auditorium on Friday, April 11th, beginning at 12:00 noon and continuing until 3:00 p.m. Following the tradition of the Christian church each of the participating ministers will

preach on one of the Seven Last Words. These words were those said by Jesus Christ as he hung on the Cross on Good Friday. The Rev. Clarence E. Miller of the First Methodist Church will preach on the first word; the Rev. C. M. Northup, of the First Baptist Church will preach on the second word; the Rev. Homer H. Miller, minister of the First Evangelical United Brethren Church will preach on the fifth word; the Rev. Cecil J. England minister of the First Christian Church will preach on the sixth word and the Rector of St. Andrew's Episcopal Church, the Rev. Arthur E. Bello will preach on the seventh and last word. The entire Good Friday program will be under the direction of the Rev. Paul G. Wenske, pastor of the First Lutheran Church of Torrance.

Moose Concert Set For Sunday

The Loyal Order of Moose "Child City" combined Catholic and Protestant choirs of 150 voices will be heard in a special coast-to-coast program on Easter Sunday, according to word received from the Mutual Broadcasting System, George Powell, governor of the Torrance lodge, announced this week.

The combined choirs, consisting of boys and girls between the ages of 8 and 18, all fatherless children, will sing Albert Robert Gaul's religious cantata, "The Holy City," during this second annual Easter broadcast from Mooseheart, Ill.

Emanating from the House of God at Mooseheart, the special broadcast will carry messages from Robert F. Hurligh, MBS newscaster, the Rt. Rev. C. Donzel Payne, Protestant resident minister.

Broadcast time has been tentatively scheduled for 9:30 to 10 p.m., but those interested have been advised to check with radio station KHL or late radio listings, said Powell.

EASTER AND HUMAN NEED EASTER SERVICE TOPIC

Two Easter worship services will be held at the First Methodist Church, El Prado and Manuel Ave. on Sunday, at 9:15 and 11:50 a.m. Rev. Clarence E. Miller, minister, will be in charge of both services which will be identical in order of worship, music and sermon. The adult choir under the direction of Vernon Robinson and the Children's Choir, directed by Mrs. Thomas Evans will sing the special Easter music and assist the minister in the worship service. The Easter sermon will be on the theme: "Easter and Human Need." According to the announcement given by Rev. Miller, this sermon will deal with such questions as, "Can an historical event 2000 years ago have spiritual significance for us today? 'Is human need today basically physical or spiritual,' and 'Is there power to be found in Faith in the Risen Christ to meet basic needs today?'" Regular nursery and Sunday School classes will be held during each service of the church.

Jewish Faith Fetes Passover

At sunset on April 9th, corresponding to the 14th day of the Hebrew month of Nisna, Jewry inaugurated the "Pesach," or Passover Festival, commemorating the 3264th anniversary of the liberation of the Israelites from Egyptian bondage, under the yoke of Pharaoh, according to H. Yeskin, publicity chairman for Temple Mennah in Redondo Beach.

The last night before the departure from Egypt is recalled with a "Seder," or Order of the Service, where articles of food symbolic of the slavery and freedom of the Israelites occupy the festive table. Foremost among these is the "Matzo," or Unleavened Bread, to remember the flat, hard, bread of slaves fleeing oppression, when their departure was so hasty that there was no time to prepare the dough properly, and the bread that was baked in the sun was without leaven.

Pesach was also celebrated as the beginning of the agricultural year, and was the first of the three pilgrimage festivals, when all Israelites journeyed to Jerusalem to thank God for His bounty.

The holiday is observed for eight days, ending at sunset on Thursday, April 17th. It has been cherished by Jews through the ages as a symbol of the past, and as a pledge for the future—for the brotherhood of man, and for the liberation of all oppressed peoples.

Temple Mennah, of 112 South Catalina Ave., Redondo Beach will hold a Community seder on Wednesday, April 9th, at 7:00 p.m. Rabbi Moshe S. Amine will conduct the reading of the "Haggadah," which is a comprehensive account of the Israelites in Egypt and their final departure. A catered Seder dinner will be served with special attention given to the children. For reservations please call Mrs. Marie Mohr at Frontler 5-2747.

Special "Yizkor" or Memorial Services will be held on Thursday, April 17th, at 10:00 a.m. at 200 North Catalina Ave., Redondo Beach.

Roosevelt Park Service Set for 5 a.m.

Included in this program will be the music of the giant outdoor organ which is one of the worlds largest. Also Einar Waerme, the noted Swedish tenor soloist will sing during the program. Evangelist Wayne Westberg will bring the resurrection message, and many of the local ministers will participate in this service.

The 4th annual sunrise service of the combined Walteria churches will be held on Sunday morning at 5:30 in Walteria park. The event is sponsored annually by the Walteria Business Men's Club. Trumpet taps will be presented by Dale Wickstrom, a teacher at Walteria School. Two choral selections will be performed by a combined choir, according to Whitmer. There will also be a

trio from the Walteria Assembly of God Church on the program, he concluded.
