School Building Program Gets Federal Aid

Immediate construction of a new school to serve the southeast portion of Torrance was made possible last week by a federal government grant of \$340,000, the school board announced recently.

A tentative allocation of \$2,051,000 granted to the school district by the U.S. Department of Education, was also disclosed.

The financial aid is granted under Public Law 515 which allocates funds to districts burdened by population jumps because of defense production.

The district has received \$152,000 from the federal government under provisions of another law granted aid for maintenance and operation. Another similar allocation is expected during the next fiscal year.

L. C. Burger, Safety Leader, Retires Here

Leslie C. Burger, one of the pioneer safety engineers in Southern California retired from his position of Supervisor of Safety and Plant Protection of the Torrance, Calif. Plant of the Columbia-Geneva Steel Division of U. S. Steel Company, Don E. Rice, General Superintendent, said recently.

Mr. Burger retired April 21 after 22 years continuous service at the Torrance Plant where he started with the Columbia Steel Company as Safety and Welfare Manager. The United States Steel Corporation had just purchased the property and the lost time accident frequency rate was 39 for every million hours worked. Under Mr. Burger's guidance a safety program was inaugurated. At the end of the first year the frequency rate had dropped to nine accidents per million hours worked. Since that date safety records have been broken continuously at the Torrance Plant with the 1951 mark a record of 1.92 accidents per million hours worked.
