

Loranger Named Chairman of Ballot Group

Paul Loranger was elected last Wednesday night to serve as temporary chairman of the Ballot Battalion. He will serve in that capacity until the nominating committee presents a list of candidates for election to the permanent office.

"Our first undertaking," Chairman Loranger said, "will be to get registered voters out to the polls for the June 3rd primaries. Then we will concentrate on an all-out drive to get eligible voters registered for the November election."

Other branches of the Ballot Battalion to be set up at the next meeting include laws and regulations, finance, speakers, and candidate information. Pointing out that just one vote gave California its statehood, Loranger urged every citizen to join the ranks of the Ballot Battalion.
