The South Bay B'Nain B'rith Women will hold their third annual dinner dance on Sunday, May 18th, at the Palos Verdes Country club.

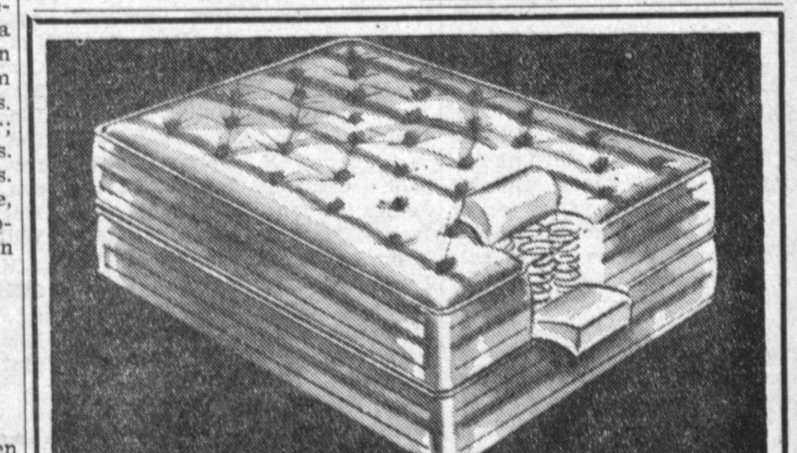
