

Scores of her fellow Torrance High School students Tuesday morning filed past the coffin of 15-year-old Voncille Ellaine Silva, who assertedly took her own life Friday night after being denied permission to attend the high school senior prom. Her father, Manuel T. Silva, journeyed from Vallejo to attend a private family service at 1:00 p.m.

Tuesday afternoon in Stone and Myers chapel. Private interment services followed.

The girl, who lived at 23017 Doris Way, was pronounced dead upon arrival at Harbor General Hospital where she was taken after she was found unconscious in her bed by a brother, Richard, 12, Saturday morning.

Police said the girl had taken an overdose of sleeping pills. The despondent girl left a brief note explaining her action. It read in part: "Dear Mom:

"I'm sorry for what I said last night. I couldn't afford to go away; I'm too young to get married. So this is the only way to

The note was signed "Sister." Police said the mother, near collapse, reported that she had lenied her daughter permission to attend the dance because she had been "dating" too often and had been reprimanded for cutting classes at school. A coroner's jury listed the death as suicide.

"We suspect that both liquor and narcotics are being sold to the youngsters, but as yet we have no proof of this," he further related. "The boys who engaged in the Sunday fisticuffs seem to have been under the influence of either alcohol or

"We have a terrific drug problem in Torrance as well as along the entire west coast. We're hampered by lax laws and lax parents. Lack of adequate parental supervision is the major cause of incidents such as last Sunday's," Cook stated. "Fortunately there were no Torrance youngsters involved, but there may be the next time it happens."
