

Special Classes Offered For "Slow Readers"

Compton Counseling Service, Inc. is sponsoring a six weeks program of Remedial Reading. The course will begin Monday, June 16, 9:00 a.m. and conclude Friday, July 25. It will be held at the Service, 1317 East Golden Avenue, Compton.

A Mother's conference will be held Monday, June 16 at 9:00 a.m. Registrations will be taken that day. The purpose of the conference is to acquaint the parents with the Remedial Reading course.

LuVena Sparks, public school teacher, will direct the classes. Mrs. Sparks, a member of the staff of the Compton Counseling Service, holds a life certificate for teaching in the elementary schools. She will be assisted by Leona Prudence, counselor and staff member of the service.

The course is planned to meet the needs of the "slow reader" as well as the "mechanically-minded" child. The purpose of the class is to teach the child that he can read and that reading can be fun. Children who have not been able to keep pace with the requirements of their class would benefit by the remedial reading tutoring. There are several methods by which children learn to read. Some learn to read by sight, some by sound and others by actual construction of a project. To develop skill in reading, both sight and sound ways must be practiced by the average child.

Children will be grouped according to age. Each class will be limited to ten (10) and will meet one hour each day. For further information, please call NE. 2-8812.
