School Library Doubles Book and Film Service

The district library of the Torrance Unified School District showed a total book circulation in the school year 1951-52 of 85.850 as compared with 34,008 for the previous year.

District Librarian Trudy Burbage revealed the following figures of the school system library service during the past year; Textbooks circulated 16,615; trade books 50,000; State manuals 150.

To carry out its present-day job of audio-visual education to implement the work of the classroom teacher, Miss Burbage pointed out that the library handled 2,418 films during the school year. The library carried out the additional service of distributing models wherever they were deemed necessary to improve instruction. In addition, the library secured 150 models from the Los Angeles County Museum for distribution to Torrance classrooms.

To further improve instruction. over 2,500 still pictures were used throughout the year and tape recorders were used on 55 different occasions




