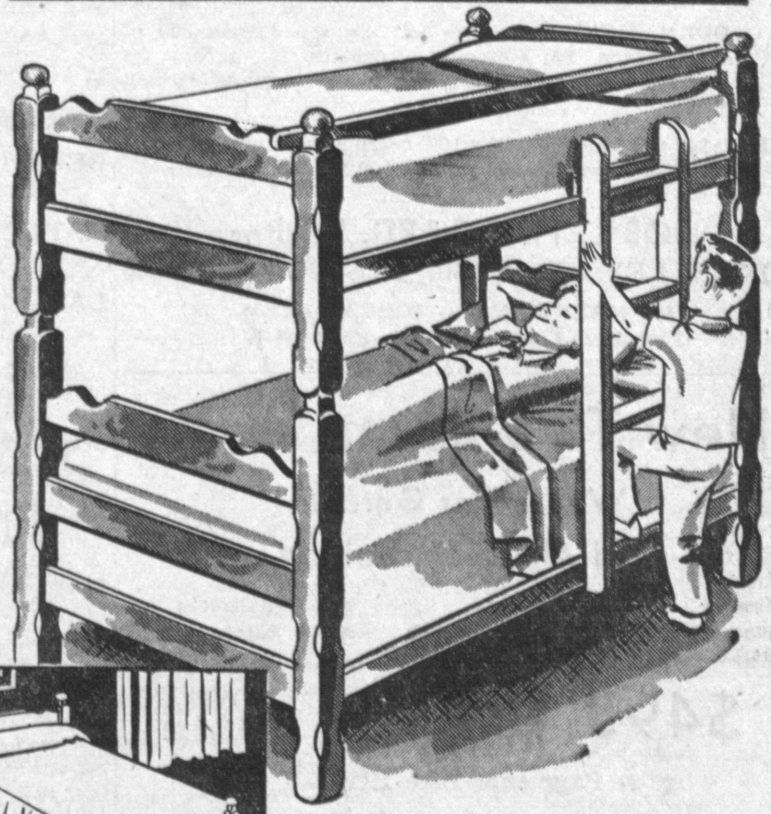
Difficulty

If the news of the world is distressing, you can get change of pace by speculating on the size of your taxes for the coming year.—Christian Science Monitor.

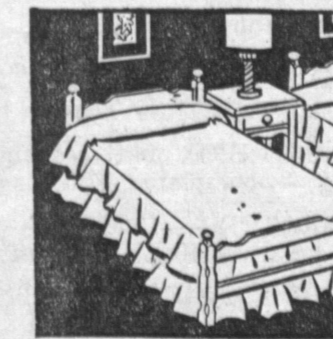
