### Keystone Area Valuation Set At \$30 Million

Total assessed valuation of the area to be annexed to the West Basin Water Association has been raised from \$20,000,000 to \$30,000,000 by the county assessor's office. Carl Fossette, secretary of the West Basin, said the original estimate of the evaluation of Dominguez and Keystone proved inadequate on a recheck by the county assessor and the figure was revised. It is necessary to know the value of territory to be annexed to determine back taxes to be paid the West Basin on annexation, he said.

### Elderly Local Man Drowns, Strangles Self

Apparently despondent over ill health, a 62-year-old man Monday drowned himself in the swimming pool of the private estate on which he was the caretaker. Henry Deming Armstrong tied a stout cord around his legs, then looped it about his neck, and toppled himself into the eight-foot-deep pool. His body was discovered after 15 or 16 hours in the pool by Val Gene Mott, owner of the estate at 18148 Hawthorne Blvd., on which Armstrong worked. County lifeguards Tom Mulhern and Bill Comer removed the body. Funeral services will be conducted at 2 p.m. today for the man, who was a native of Rigby, Idaho.

### \$100,000 In Signals Due Here

Traffic hazards throughout Keystone and surrounding areas will be sharply reduced during the current fiscal year when almost \$100,000 worth of traffic control devices are to be installed in the harbor area, it was announced last week by Harry Parker, head of the county traffic design department. The largest sum, \$45,000, is earmarked for three intersections of Sepulveda Blvd. here. They are Normandie, Vermont and Wilmington Aves., which will receive traffic signals. The state division of highways is to install signals at Sepulveda's intersection with Figueroa St., which is a state highway. Signals are already in operation at Sepulveda and Main St. and Avalon Blvd. They were installed during the past fiscal year.
