Upholstery Class Slated At El Camino

In keeping with its policy of making available to its district new courses as the demand arises, El Camino College is adding upholstery to its curricula this fall, college officials disclosed today. This decision was reached after an extensive survey of the job opportunities in this field revealed that Los Angeles is now second in furniture production in the United States, and many jobs at good wages are now being offered to trained men in this interesting trade, it was disclosed. **Two Classes Daily** Both day and evening classes have been scheduled. Day classes will be offered to young men desiring pre-employment training in upholstery and evening trade extension classes will be held to increase the skill and earning power of those already engaged in the industry. To instruct these classes, the college has selected Mr. Sumner Power, a journeyman upholsterer with a background of over twenty years of both factory and custom shop upholstery, six years of which he was supervising instructor of upholstery at West Coast University. Many of his former students are employed as journeymen upholsterers, or are conducting their own upholstery business today. **September Registration** Registration for classes in upholstery at El Camino will begin September 15, 1952. Schedules will be available after August 15. Vocational counselors are available to assist those interested in this course.


