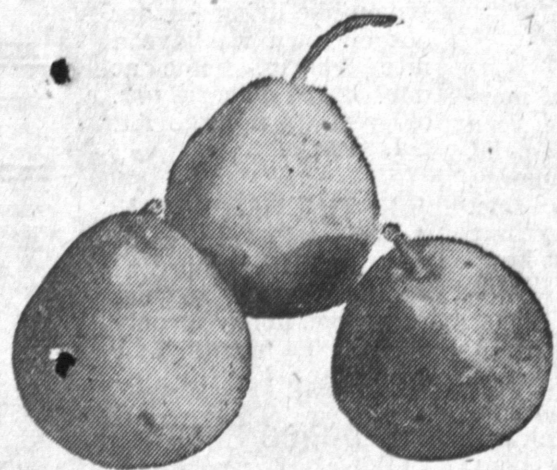

in the country, according to Babbitt.

National birth rate is high, and to foster an increased birth rate, government awards are given to parents on the birth of the fifth and tenth child. Infant mortality is very low, Babbitt states, partly because of the many clean, modern hospitals in Israel.

Fish and vegetables are diet staples, along with tea and an ersatz coffee. Milk must be boiled, since there is no pasteurization in Israel.

Commenting on the climate of the Middle Eastern country, Babbitt states the year-round weather is much like Southern California, without smog.

(Continued from Page 1) glycol per year. Polyethylene is the "wonder plastic" from which a long list of new products including "squeeze bottles" and other packaging materials are being made. Ethylene glycol, which also has a variety of uses, is known principally as the base for permanent anti-freeze, the best known brand of which is Prestone Anti-Freeze.

"Ours will be the first large petrochemical plant to be built in the West and this is an indication of our organization's faith in the future growth of this great area," Dr. Davidson said.

Other Plants Carbide and Carbon Chemicals Company, which is a division of Union Carbide and Carbon Corporation, operates similar petrochemical plants in South Charleston, W. Va., Texas City, Texas, and Whiting, Ind.

In negotiations for the sale of the site and the supply contract General Petroleum was represented by Gale L. Adams, vice president in charge of manufacturing. "We feel we are fortunate in three ways in concluding these new agreements. We've gained some new and very pleasant neighbors, we've helped bring a fine new plant to the South Bay area, and we found a new market for the by-products of our Torrance refinery," Adams said.

El Camino Plans Varsity Alumni Game

El Camino Alumni gridders have called an organizational meeting for the College Campus Center, Tuesday, August 12 at 7:30 p.m. Plans for the annual Varsity-Alumni football game, September 19, will be made at this time. Only those former Warriors who played for El Camino during the past 3 seasons will be eligible according to Alumni and College officials. The past two games have been divided with the Varsity taking the first one in 1950 by a score of 13-6 and the alumni the second in 1951, 22-6.

The traditional season opener has filled the 7000 seat Camino stadium each year and has been thrill packed from the opening whistle. Such grid greats as Phil Dehr of Inglewood, Socco Torres of Redondo, Dick Turner of Torrance and Don Jurk of El Segundo keep the new crop of athletes on their toes. Indications are that the former stars will have their hands full with the caliber of high school athletes moving to the Warrior campus in September.

Federal Tax Costs Shown

Torrance and Los Angeles County residents were given a local "box score on taxes" by the National Association of Manufacturers.

These communities were included in a survey of tax burdens, which showed that local taxpayers give up about four and a half times the cost of local government to meet the Federal burden.

They give up about three times as much money to the Federal Government as they pay to the state of California in taxes.

Recreation

(Continued from Page 1) clated the problems of the school board, and recommended that the board submit to the council a letter outlining ways in which the board could participate in the recreation program.

Shidier promised that such a letter would be forthcoming within 15 days. Councilman Drale told the board that the city was being burdened by the high cost of maintaining guards at busy intersections to protect school children.

The school officials pointed out that under a county ruling, schools may not allocate money for this purpose.

Drale also pointed out that streets, curbs and gutters were not being installed in front of all new school buildings. He asked if that should not be included in the bids submitted for school building contracts, rather than relying on the city to do it.

Dr. J. H. Hull, Superintendent of Schools, stated that curbs and sidewalks were being installed at most of the new schools, but that he felt the streets should be installed by the city. He pointed out that city crews can do this far more cheaply, than the schools can.

Thief Gets \$75

Two thefts were this week reported in the Hollywood Riviera section. Thomas Mabin of 209 Via Coluse, told Torrance Police that someone broke a window in the rear of his home and entered.

No loss was reported, police disclosed.

A second theft was reported by Larry B. Connor, 156 Via Los Miradores. Connor told police that during the absence of the family someone entered the house, ransacked a bureau, and made off with \$75.
