

Disputed Rail Spur Crossing Constructed

KEYSTONE — Construction of the spur track grade crossing on the Santa Fe Railroad across Sepulveda Blvd. at Broad Ave. was completed very swiftly this month after the state public utilities commission approved installation of the line at a session in San Francisco.

Work on the roadbed for the spur track is now underway. Cost of the right of way reportedly was \$23,000. The line will follow Broad Ave. south to Bond St. and then make a slight turn east across Lake Ave. and join the main track at Dolores St.

Right of way for the remainder of the spur line was acquired by the Santa Fe from Sepulveda Blvd. south to its main track at Dolores St. and the Los Angeles city limits.

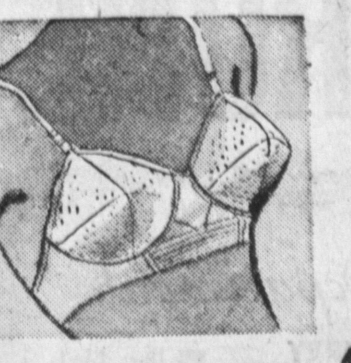
