

File \$40,000 Suit Against Garage Owner

A suit for over \$40,000 was this week filed by John Baker, a visitor from Pennsylvania, against Virgel Bolles, owner of an auto repair service at 1750 Carson St.

The suit alleges that on Aug. 15, Bolles committed assault and battery upon Baker when he complained about some work Bolles had done on his car.

Baker charges that he suffered the loss of two teeth and lacerations about the mouth when Bolles struck him.

Bolles claims that Baker approached him belligerently, and that in self-defense he gave Baker a shove.

Baker is asking \$25,000 general damages, \$15,000 exemplary damages, and \$250 for dental and medical expenses incurred as the result of the alleged assault, according to his attorney, Don Armstrong.

"We are certainly grateful that the City Council did not go ahead with its plan for a six-cent increase," he continued. "Frankly, I don't know what they would do with the money. Aside from that, we insist that it is not legal nor good government to levy a rate higher than that necessary to finance a year's operation of the municipality."

Gianni also said he was glad to see the County of Los Angeles and the Metropolitan Water District paring taxes.

"We hope that Torrance Unified School District can do the same," he concluded, "because that is what Torrance Unified Taxpayers want, lower taxes and economy in government."

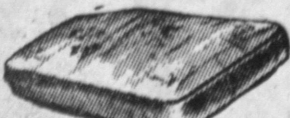
Adult Counseling Offered at Harbor Tech College
