

### Red Cross Gives First Aid Awards

Torrance Branch of American National Red Cross has issued Red Cross certificates to another group of persons who have completed the Advanced First Aid course, it was announced this week by George Powell, first aid chairman of Torrance Branch and assistant director of civil defense for this area.

Certificates were awarded to the following after completion of the 12-hour course: Dorothy Alexander, Martha E. Alexander, Lillian Ballard, Roy E. Campbell, Alice M. Griggs, Dorothea A. These persons had previously been instructed in the 22-hour Standard First Aid Course which includes lessons in Atomic First Aid.

Mrs. Meade Ferguson, director of the instruction program, stated that in the event of disaster in this city, these persons and all others who have taken first aid will be called upon to assist doctors and nurses in shelters to care for those wounded and injured.

Another Standard First Aid Course has tentatively been scheduled for the latter part of September, according to Powell. Persons interested in taking this course are asked to call Torrance 3447, 3448, or 1755 to enroll, he announced.
