Doctor Says

School Work Hard On Child's Eyes

Many children are handicapped by vision defects that are not detected by routine tests, according to Dr. Allen L. Pyeatt of Torrance, who returned recently from the Vision Training Workshop at San Jose, held annually by California optometrists. How to overcome faulty vision in children is one of the objects of the Workshop, where modern equipment used for vision training is discussed and demonstrated by national authorities.

Dr. Pyeatt points out that school work is a load on vision that was never anticipated by nature. Although eye charts may indicate normal vision at a distance, learning to read can cause unnatural adjustments and strain that result in poor school work. In such cases, modern training methods may improve vision and eliminate strain,
