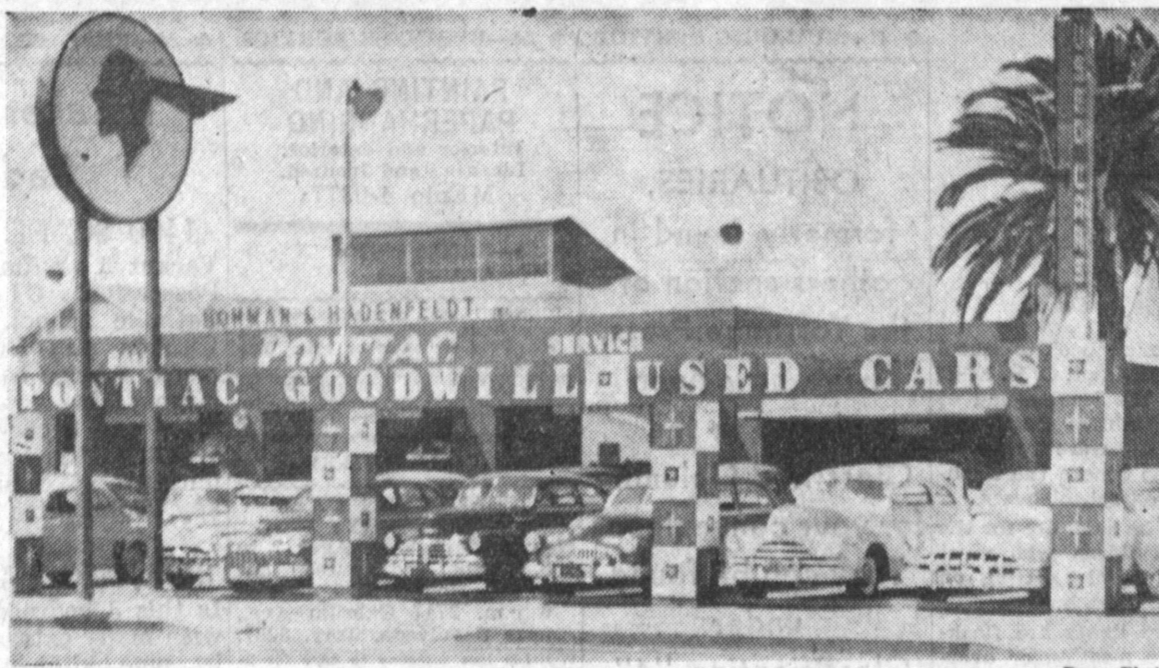

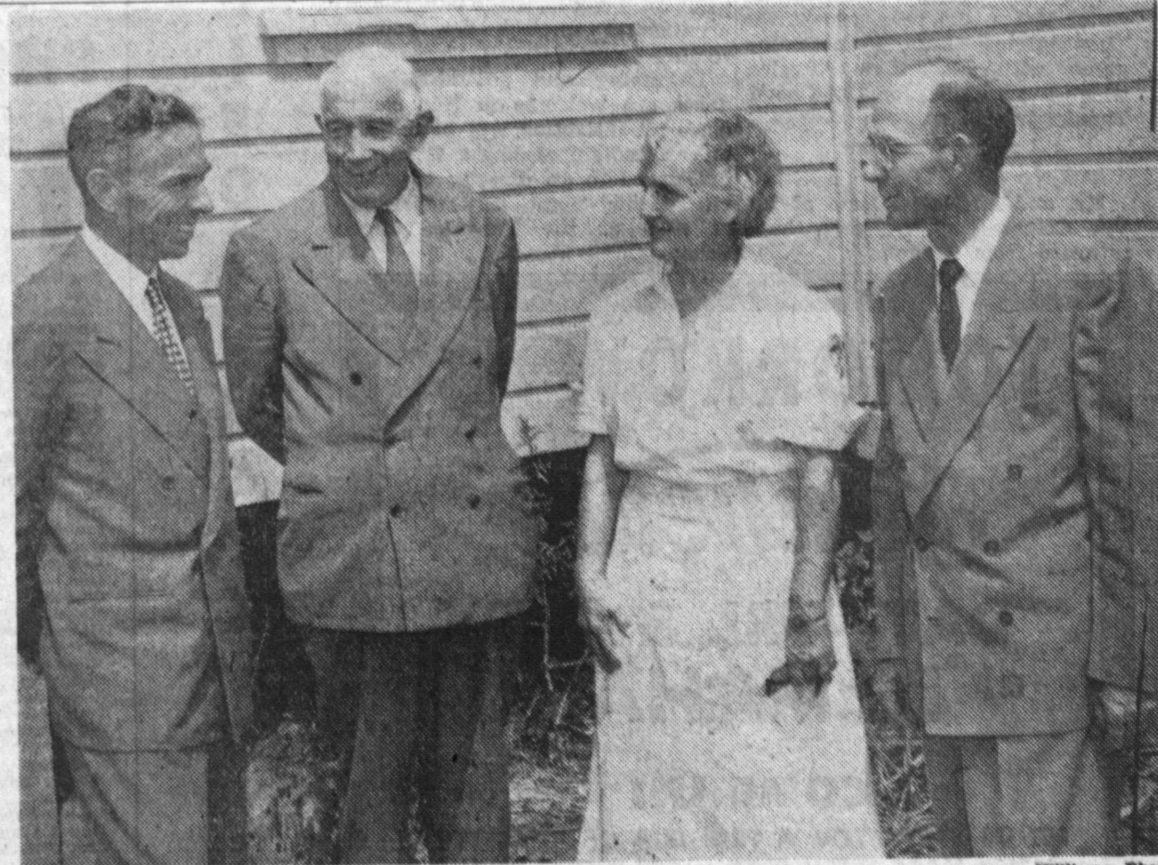
American Gold Star Mothers Meet Tuesday
