

Plan Remodeling Of 1st Methodist Church Sanctuary

Plans to purchase an electric organ and to remodel the main sanctuary of the First Methodist Church were announced this week by Rev. John L. Taylor, who re-



turned to the pulpit after a brief vacation at Twin Lakes.

The plans call for moving the altar further back in the chancel, with the choir on both sides. A new lectern and pulpit has been given to the church, and will be installed with the organ, Rev. Taylor said.

Rev. Taylor has been pastor of the church in Torrance since July 1, when he was assigned to this parish at the Annual Conference at Redlands. In the two months of the summer, plans have been made to enlarge the program morning worship services, one at 9:00 A.M. and the other at 11 A.M. At the nine o'clock hour there will be church school classes for the children through the fourth grades. The youth from fifth grade and above will be in the worship service and will program will begin the first Sunday of October, according to Rev. Taylor.

KNIGHT APOLOGIZES TO CECIL KING FOR 'POLITICAL ERROR'

Robert H. Finch, Inglewood attorney and 17th District Congressional nominee, today issued a statement explaining a letter of apology recently received by incumbent Congressman Cecil R. King from Lt. Gov. Goodwin Knight.

Knight addressed the letter to Rep. King correcting what Knight termed was a "political error" in reference to King's voting record, and apologizing to King for the error.

Knight early last month made a political speech in Torrance on behalf of Finch, and blamed the error made in the speech on Finch.

Finch, in explaining the error, stated that he had received inaccurate information from one of his researchers, according to Knight's letter.

Finch expressed regret about the misunderstanding that led to the incident.
