He also pointed out that revenue from court fines will be severely clipped by the change. The new court will take 25 per cent of all city violation fines. Under the current set-up, it will also take 25 per cent of all criminal fines. A move has been started however, he reports, to up that figure to a full 50 per cent. After all, he said, there are nine clerks and two judges to be supported in the new court.  
Chief Stroh also stated that the amount of revenue lost by this city in one year would probably cover the cost of construction of a court house here, and probably also pay the judge's salary for a year.

areas will pay to the Metropolitan Water District, parent organization of the West Basin Water District, on annexation to that body, Fossette said.  
The \$3,834,000 will be paid by Dominguez and Keystone property owners in equal annual payments over a 30-year period. The share of the average property owner in Dominguez and Keystone will be approximately \$9 a year for the 30-year period.  
The annexation move was started last spring by a Citizens water Fact-Finding Committee which pointed out that ground water resources are being conserved through a ruling of the State Water Resources Board and if there was to be adequate water for the expanding area it would have to be brought in from the outside.  
Balloting on the annexation is slated for Tuesday. Ten consolidated precincts have been set up. 
