The United States Civil Service Commission today announced examinations for Fishery Marketing Specialist positions in the Fish and Wildlife Service in Washington, D. C., and throughout the country, and for Medical Officer (Rotating Intern, Psychiatric Resident, General Practice Resident) in St. Elizabeths Hospital in Washington, D. C.

The Fishery Marketing Specialist positions pay \$3,410 a year. Medical Officer, Rotating Intern positions pay \$2,800 a year; Psychiatric Resident, \$3,400 to \$4,200; and General Practice Resident, \$3,000 to \$3,800 a year.
