Girl Presented Flag in Honor Of Dead Father

Twelve-year-old Irene Craig was last week presented with a United States flag in honor of her father who died in a Japanese prison camp during World War II. The presentation was made in the name of the Dominguez-Carson area Rotary Club by James G. Caldwell, treasurer of the group.

S/Sgt. Howard E. Craig joined the Army in 1932, and was among the first to join the war in the Pacific. He was captured by the Japanese in 1942. On July 7, 1945, his family was informed that he had died while interned on June 18, 1942.

The Rotary Club following their established custom, presented the child with the flag that would have covered her father's coffin had he been buried here.

Two Carson Tracts Get County OK
