Part of Riviera District to Get Sewers

Notice was this week made to homeowners in Hollywood Riviera that sanitary sewers would be installed in only a limited area of the community.

Following action taken last week by the City Council, plans are being drawn up to put sewers into District No. 3 (the area was divided into three districts for

more efficient planning) and not into the two other districts. District No. 3 is in upper Hollywood Riviera.

The Council declined to grant sewers to the other district because of the low percentage of signatures on a position circulated in the area recently. About 56 per cent of the homeowners in District No. 3 signed the petitions.
