### CECIL KING'S MANY BILLBOARDS SAY... "FIGHT COMMUNISM"

## DOES THIS LOOK LIKE THE RECORD OF A MAN WHO HAS REALISTICALLY FOUGHT COMMUNISM?

### Cecil King-Vito Marcantonio-Helen Gahagan Douglas Voting Record:

- 1/3/45... King, Douglas and Marcantonio voted against establishing the Committee on Un-American Activities as a standing committee of the House. Bill passed.
- 11/1/45... King was reported as AGAINST and Douglas and Marcantonio voted against free press amendment to Supplemental UNRAA Appropriation Bill. (Passed). This amendment provided that no goods purchased with United States funds should be furnished to "any country, or any territory, or any colony, or any other area, in which the controlling government interferes with or refuses full and free access to the news of any and all activities of the UNRAA by representatives of the press and radio of the United States." Until then, Polish and Yugoslav government used UNRAA supplies, labeled them as their own and discriminated against non-Communists in their distribution.
- 4/16/46... King, Douglas and Marcantonio voted against contempt proceedings against Joint Anti-Fascist Refugee Committee, of which Gerhard Eisler was one of the principal leaders, and which refused to reveal organization records to the Committee on Un-American Activities. Information then in the hands of the Committee indicated that the Joint Anti-Fascist Refugee Committee was a subversive Communist organization, but refusal to open its books blocked the committee from making a full investigation. Passed 292-56. Eisler escaped to East Germany.
- 4/18/46... King, Douglas and Marcantonio voted AGAINST resolution authorizing the Judiciary Committee to investigate the disposition of charges of espionage and possession of secret government documents against six individuals, three of them Government employees. Although the secret documents had been stolen and some were found in possession of the pro-Communist magazine AMERASIA, the charges had been dismissed except in the case of two individuals who were punished, with small fines. Bill passed.
- 5/17/46... King, Douglas and Marcantonio voted against appropriations for House Committee on Un-American Activities to continue its investigation and reporting on Un-American, Communist, Fascist and other radical and subversive activities. Bill passed 240-81.
- 6/28/46... King, Douglas and Marcantonio voted AGAINST Free Press Amendment to UNRAA. Bill passed 228-85.
- 7/15/47... King, Douglas and Marcantonio voted against Federal Employees' Loyalty Bill, which passed 319-61. This bill was necessitated by evidence that there were substantial numbers of disloyal and subversive employees on the Federal payroll.
- 5/13/48... King, Douglas and Marcantonio voted AGAINST resolution directing all executive departments and agencies of the government to make available to any and all committees of the House and Senate information deemed necessary to enable them to perform properly the duties delegated to them by Congress. Bill passed.
- 5/19/48... King, Douglas and Marcantonio voted against the Subversive Activities Control Act of 1948, requiring registration with the Attorney General of Communist political and Communist front organizations, and making unlawful activities to establish a totalitarian dictatorship in the United States under foreign control. Passed 319-58.
- 3/9/48... King, Douglas and Marcantonio voted AGAINST appropriating \$200,000 for work of the Committee on Un-American Activities. Passed 337-37.
- 6/29/49... King, Douglas and Marcantonio voted against amendment barring payment of salary to employees failing to sign affidavits stating they are not members of any subversive party or an organization which may strike against the government. (Such provisions have been placed in all appropriation bills for several years to bar Communists from the public payrolls. Bill passed.
